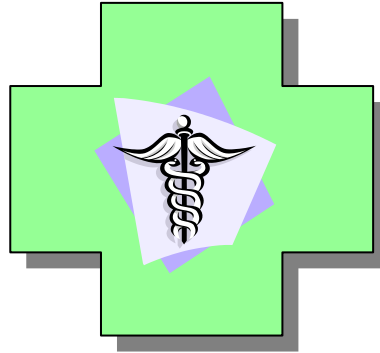

# Pharmacotherapy in the critically ill child
