PICANET DATA COLLECTION FORMS

In December 2017 we released details of the revised Referral, Transport and Admission datasets. All PICUs and PIC centralised transport services are asked to submit the new datasets for all events from January 1st 2018.

Copies of the new data collection forms have been circulated, please destroy any previous versions.

Versions currently in use are:

Admissions: 'Version 9.4 October 2017', Referrals: 'Version 2.4 October 2017', and Transport: 'Version 2.1 October 2017'.

PICANET DATA REQUESTS

To comply with contractual obligations, HQIP who are the Data Owner of data collected by PICANet from English PICUs, require all data requests to follow a specific procedure.

If your data request includes data from English PICUs:

Step 1

Please complete the PICANet online request form as usual. PICANet will send your data request to our Clinical Advisory Group for comment and approval after we have checked it is feasible.

Step 2:

HQIP have two forms which need completing: a data access request form and a data sharing agreement. Guidance on the HQIP data access process and the required forms are available on the <u>HQIP website</u>. Guidance and other Data Access Request information are also available there.

The HQIP data access request form must be signed by PICANet before HQIP will consider the request. This means you must send PICANet the completed HQIP data access request form.
