Krish is based at GOSH but will be travelling around all of the Pan Thames PICUs (St Mary's, St Georges', Lewisham, Royal Brompton, Guy's, Brighton, Addenbrookes, King's College, and Great Ormond Street) on a regular basis. He will be involved with facilitating data collection and data transmission.

Co-director, Gareth Parry has returned to Sheffield after a year working in the US as a Harkness Fellow in Health Care Policy at the Children's Hospital, Boston and Harvard School of Public Health. He was examining how patient safety can be improved in paediatric settings.

- There was a feeling from audit staff that the second half of the day was less relevant to them.
- It would be interesting to have more information on how PICANet is being used by PICUs locally.

Hopefully, the problems which lead to delays in production and printing of our first report have now been resolved, so that the next report will be delivered in plenty of time.

We will be taking all your comments into consideration when planning the next meeting and would still welcome any further feedback, particularly on the format of the day or suggestions of possible speakers.

# Validation Reports

Units are now receiving monthly validation reports. Hopefully you are not finding them too much work, but here are some tips which may help reduce their size:

- If you cannot find a time of admission for a child to your unit, record the time the first observations were charted.
- 70% of errors are caused by missing values if the information is genuinely 'not known'
  rather than missing enter "99" or "999" etc.
- Sending in your data to the server on a regular basis will result in shorter reports.

### New Software

We have been taking note of all your comments about the current version of the PICANet software and are in the process of finalising a new version together with new data collection forms.
