## PICANET DATA REQUESTS



Ofran Almassawi Initially did a project as part of her MSc med stats at LSHTM. Her project used 11 years of PICANet data for infants 0-12 months. Ofran's results showed higher admission rates for boys but higher within PICU mortality for girls. The variables available in the dataset did not explain the difference in mortality. Ofran extended the project in an attempt to identify possible reasons for the mortality difference as part of an NIHR Clinical Doctoral Research Fellowship award. She has been informed that this has now been successful, and will involve collaboration with Prof Bianca De Stavola, Dr Katie Harron, Dr Simon Nadel and the PICANet team through Richard Feltbower. Prior to that, Ofran received help with the data and formulation of her project from members of the PICANet Team- Roger Parslow and Melpo. Ofran said '(They) offered me enormous assistance in getting the data for the MSc project.' PICANet would like to wish Ofran every success and look forward to reviewing her final outcomes.
